Jordan serves as project manager for multiple group captives and insurance companies, performing both interim and year-end reserve analyses, and yearly funding analyses. He is responsible for the preparation of Statements of Actuarial Opinion (SAOs), and also produces estimates of unpaid claims liabilities and funding projections.

In addition, Jordan develops simulation applications that determine risk transfer in reinsurance contracts consistent with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice (SSAP) No. 62, as well as simulation applications that calculate risk margins using company specific data. Further, he has assisted in the development of several models used for loss fund projections and unpaid claims estimates.
